CCSCC Championship Points Rules  
March 2024**

**Purpose (aka, Points Rules)**

The purpose of the annual awards program is to recognize outstanding and consistent performance in CCSCC motorsports activities and to promote participation and volunteer work at CCSCC events. This document describes the points assigned to participants' activities for end-of-the-year recognition.

**General Information**

1. The points-year runs from January 1 through December 31.
2. Members who pay their dues before the first event will have points from all events counted towards end-of-the-year awards.
3. Anyone who pays dues after the March club meeting will earn points only for events attended from the date dues were paid to end of year.
4. First time CCSCC members will earn points for all events their first calendar-year regardless of when they pay their dues in that calendar year.
5. An "event" is a single day that is not a "school" or "test-n-tune".
6. If a Rally or Autocross class has a single driver/car registered that driver will only be eligible for 9 points.
  - a. For example: If only one driver has times posted in a class by the end of the event, that driver will only be eligible for 9 points. Assume 2 drivers register for B-Street class and the 2<sup>nd</sup> driver is a "no show" or if their car is not capable of crossing the starting line, that qualifies for a Single Driver class.
  - b. Example 2: In a 2-driver class, if the 2<sup>nd</sup> driver's car "breaks" on the first run after they cross the starting line, they would post a DNF and that counts as a 2-driver class.
7. For classes with 2 or more drivers/cars with posted times, the following table will be used:

<b>Finish</b>	<b>Rally</b>	<b>Autocross</b>
1 <sup>st</sup> Place	10 Points	10 Points
2 <sup>nd</sup> Place	9 Points	9 Points
3 <sup>rd</sup> Place	8 Points	8 Points
4 <sup>th</sup> Place	7 Points	7 Points

5 <sup>th</sup> Place	6 Points	6 Points
6 <sup>th</sup> Place	5 Points	5 Points
7 <sup>th</sup> Place	4 Points	4 Points
8 <sup>th</sup> Place	3 Points	3 Points
9 <sup>th</sup> Place	2 Points	2 Points
10 <sup>th</sup> Place +	1 Point	1 Point

8. Year-End awards may be given for each area shown below:
- a) Rally – Open
  - b) Rally – Women's
  - c) Autocross – Open
  - d) Autocross – Women's
  - e) Open Overall Championship
  - f) Women's Overall Championship
9. Points will be totaled for the best finishes in 65% of the total number of Autocross events. Separately, Rally events are counted using the same method. Exceptions to the 65% rule are if less than 4 events are offered, then all events are counted.
- For example: 15 total events X 65% = 9.75 rounded up to next integer = 10 counted events.
10. In the event of ties in the open Autocross Championship, the **overall** PAX score for each driver is used to break the tie.
11. Women may participate in the Open Rally and Open Championship categories by declaring on their membership form or informing the Points Chair that they wish the points earned by participating in or working at events to count toward the Open Awards instead of Women's Awards.
12. To be eligible for the Open Autocross Year-End championship, a woman must score at least 2/3 of her points in Open competition. Women scoring more than 1/3 of their points in the Women's classes are automatically scored in and only eligible for year-end awards in that class.
13. All numeric results will be rounded to a tenth of a decimal place.

**Rally Points**

1. Award 10 points for 1<sup>st</sup> Place Overall regardless of class size.
2. Rally masters receive 10 points for staging any rally. If the Rally Chair and the Rally Steward deem the rally a rerun of a previous rally, the rally master receives 5 points for staging the rally.
3. Rally cold runners receive 10 points for cold running any rally.
4. Other rally workers receive 8 points for each rally that they work.
5. Co-rally masters or co-cold-runners must let the Points Chair know if they want the rally master (or cold-runner) points and worker points divided between them 10/8 or 9/9.
6. To receive year end points, you must be a CCSCC member and must work one CCSCC Rally. If you did not start rallying until after July 1 of the previous points year the work requirement is waived.
7. No more than 40 points may be received in a calendar year for worker points.

**Autocross Points**

1. Award 10 Points for Fastest Time of Day (FTD) or Fastest Time of Day Indexed (FTDI) regardless of class size. A driver may only get one of these trophies and point awards at each event.
2. Event chairs receive 10 points for chairing an event (one day), whether they compete or not. This option may be used twice in a calendar year. If a person chairs more than 2 events in the year, they will receive 2 points, in addition to any points received as a participant, to a maximum of 10 points for each event/day. The 10-point option is automatically assigned for the first two events a person chairs in a calendar year. The event chair may opt to use the 2-point option instead. That will preserve the automatic 10-point awards for later in the year. This can be done by informing the Points Chair before the first car starts that day (text or email the Points Chair, [points@ccsportscarclub.org](mailto:points@ccsportscarclub.org)).

**Open & Women's Championship Award**

1. Two (2) points are awarded towards the Championship Award for each club meeting attended, up to a maximum of 22. This would be 11 of the 12 club meetings.

2. All finishers will receive weighted points towards the Championship Award (either Open or Women's) from each of the Rally and Autocross year-end total scores using the following formula:

$$\left( \frac{\text{FinishersAdjustedScore}}{\text{MaximumScore}} \right) * 100 = \text{PointsTowardsChampionship}$$

*Where:*

*Finisher's Adjusted Score = Best finishes in number of events counted (65% of the total number of events, rounded up maximum 14)*

*Maximum Score = Number of events counted x 10.*

For example: if Joe finishes first in Rally with an adjusted score of 97 out of a possible 120 total, Joe receives 80.8 points. Mark, who finished second with a total of 93 out of the possible 120 points, would receive 77.5 points.

3. Members can receive overall points from Rally, Autocross, and Meeting Attendance.

For example: a member finishing 1st in Rally and 3rd in Autocross could receive 95 points for Rally, 85 points for Autocross, and 22 points for Meeting Attendance for a total of 202 Championship points, from a maximum of 222 pts.

### **Autocross Category Championship**

The club will award four (4) championships based on performance within each of the following categories and counted in "n/2+1 rounded up" events:

1. **Street:** SS, AS, BS, CS, DS, ES, FS, GS, HS, and HCS.
2. **Street Touring:** SSC, STH, SST, STS, STR, STX, STU, CAM-T, CAM-C, CAM-S, XA, XB, XV, CSM, CSX, and EVX.
3. **Race Tire:** SSP, CSP, DSP, ESP, FSP, SSR, XP, CP, DP, EP, FP, SM, SSM, SMF, AM, BM, CM, DM, EM, FM, FSAE, KM, and HCR.
4. **Pro:** All classes are welcome. To participate, entrants need to register in Pro class with their PAX multiplier at each event.

Trophies will be awarded to drivers in categories of more than 2 drivers. Trophy eligibility will include a minimum of ½ (half) of the scored events.

For instance: if the number of scheduled events is 15, then the “n/2+1 rounded up” number is 9. Therefore, a driver must have competed in 5 events to be eligible for an end-of-the-year trophy.

All CCSCC Club members are scored in the applicable category for each autocross event entered.

Points are determined for **each event** as follows:

- The Fastest Time of Day Index time (FTDI) within each category is used as the Category Basis Time for that category.

The competitor's Event Best Index Time is used in the formula (10,000-pt system):

$$\left( \frac{\text{Category Basis Time}}{\text{Competitor's Best Index Time}} \right) * 10,000 = \text{Competitor's Category Points}$$

Example:  $(54.652/59.325) * 10,000 = 9,212$  pts for Competitor's event

Points are scored for the **year-end championship**.

Notes on calculations:

- N = number of points-based events for current season. Any cancelled events will be deducted from the total and “N” will be recalculated, and the number of scored events will also be recalculated.
- The competitor's best finishes in “N/2 + 1 and rounded up to next integer” events will be summed for the championship total using the 10,000-point system per event.
- Total Category Events are calculated with “N/2 + 1, rounded up to next integer”

For Example: N = 15 total events, so,  $15/2 = 7.5 + 1 = 8.5$ , rounded up to next integer = 9. With 15 total events, 9 is the magic number for Category Championships.

**General Notes about Trophies:**

1. Trophies will be awarded at the annual Banquet as determined by the Board, Autocross, Rally, and Points Committees.
2. Top 10 Autocross Open finishers have the option to choose one of the four awards below:
  - a. A club-supplied number that indicates their place, like 3 for 3<sup>rd</sup> place. The number will be a basic magnetic or sticky vinyl in a single color that contrasts with their current car color, i.e., Black number on a White car.
  - b. Purchase their own number and the club will reimburse up to \$35.
  - c. A voucher for a single-day event of Autocross.
  - d. Free Annual Membership for the current season to the club.
3. As of March 2023, reimbursement amounts for any of the options in #2 above will not exceed \$35.
4. A competitor may compete in multiple categories to qualify for more than one trophy. They will only receive a trophy in one category. The highest-level trophy will be awarded automatically, or they may choose which trophy to receive.

**Rookie Awards**

1. The Rally Committee may, at its discretion, award from zero (0) to four (4) Rally Rookie of the Year awards each year. General guidelines are that rookies must participate in multiple events and be ranked by some justifiable measures if more than one award is given.
2. The Autocross Committee may, at its discretion, award from zero (0) to four (4) Autocross Rookie of the Year awards each year. General guidelines are that rookies must participate in multiple events and be ranked by some justifiable measures if more than one award is given.
